The dances continue to be a big hit, drawing approximately 100-130 people each month. We provide a DJ at each dance which adds so much to the evening.

Mostly we provide cookies or snacks for the dancers. On occasions, we offer crafts or photo booths are available.

Those who attend are enjoying this new opportunity. FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR:



Initially, our organization's name was Monarc, an acronym for Monroe County Association for Retarded Children. The name changed several times, and eventually, we became **The Mon-Arc of Monroe**. Perhaps it wasn't thought of initially, but the connection to a Monarch butterfly is entirely appropriate for this organization. Monarch butterflies are magical and cherished. They represent rebirth, transformation, creativity, endless potential, vibrant joy, change, ascension, and an ability to experience the wonder of life. They teach people how to seize individual opportunities for growth and metamorphosis.

I believe we at this organization have gone through a rebirth and growth. In the last couple of years, we have increased our membership from a mere 16 to more than 100. In the state of Michigan, we are one the few Arc organizations that publish a newsletter. Some offer a bi-monthly newsletter, and a few are just by e-mail. To keep our members informed, we publish a quarterly newsletter, maintain a website and a current Facebook page. Our Social Recreation committee received grants to ensure we continue our monthly dances which offer various venues, refreshments, and crafts, and have recently started art classes for our adults. During this summer we will be focusing on expanding Sensory Friendly days at local Monroe businesses.

We are the payee representative for 135 people and as the end of the school year winds down and our IEP schedule slowly wanes, I am looking forward to attending and reporting on The State's ARC Public Policy Seminar that I will be attending on June 22nd.

We are making great strides but imagine if we think of the monarch butterfly and use it as a symbol to create our movement of growth with endless potential, we can provide more for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities in Monroe County.


